Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi was born on October 2, 1869 in Porbandar, India. He became one of the most respected spiritual and political leaders of the 19's. Gandhi helped free the Indian people from British rule through nonviolent resistance, and is honored by Indians as the father of the Indian Nation. The Dandi March, also known as the Salt March and the Dandi Satyagraha was **an act of nonviolent civil disobedience led by Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi**. The Salt March, which took place from March to April 1930 in India, **an act of civil disobedience led by Mohandas Gandhi to protest British rule in India**. . During the march, thousands of Indians followed Gandhi from his religious retreat near Ahmedabad to the Arabian Sea coast, a distance of some 240 miles.

The Salt March, led by Mahatma Gandhi, **began with around 80 people, but as more and more people joined in for the 390 km-long journey, it grew into a strong force of 50,000 people**. Salt March or Dandi March was a 24-day non-violent march led by Mahatma Gandhi **Thus showed that by working together people of conviction & courage even if each one is as small & powerless as a grain of salt can make an enormous difference**.

Mahatma Gandhi's most important message to us was to constantly follow the path of non-violence. He thought that any problem could be resolved without using violence to gain an advantage or raise your voice. Non-violence, kindness, and empathy can be used to win battles and even wars. He was reminded to maintain composure, honesty, and kindness amid challenging circumstances. You may in still in your children the value of non-violence and the idea that not every circumstance calls for a response.

Bapu always believed in the power of truth. Sometimes kids lie, whether it's a small white lie or a lie by oversight because they think it will keep them out of trouble.
