



19. Queen Victoria

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Victoria, was born on 24th May 1819 at Kensington Palace in London. Her real name was Alexandrina Victoria. Her father's name was Prince Edward and her mother's name was Saxe-Coburg-Saalfeld. Her father died of pneumonia in 1820, when she was only 8 months old. She was surrounded with love and luxury. She became Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland from 20 June 1837 until her death in 1901.

Young Victoria showed exceptional talent with French and Italian as well as with her drawing and singing lessons. As a child, Victoria was described as warmhearted, lively, and occasionally mischievous. On William IV's death in 1837, she became Queen at the age of 18. Queen Victoria is associated with Britain's great age of industrial expansion, educational advances, economic progress, abolition of slavery and workers' welfare and especially, empire. She was certainly harsh, judgmental and controlling, but could never be accused of indifference. The young Queen married Prince Albert on 10th February 1840. Prince Albert died from typhoid fever on 14th December 1861 at Windsor Castle with Queen Victoria and five of his children at his side. After Prince Albert's death, Victoria descended into deep depression, she remained in mourning and in partial retirement.

We performed a short drama on Victoria and Abdul. Abdul Karim, a young prisoner clerk from India, travels to present Queen Victoria with a mohur on her Golden Jubilee and strikes an unlikely friendship with her. Queen took interest in learning, Urdu and about Islam. She was genuinely interested in learning about her subjects in India and Abdul did help her learn about India, its history and culture.

Victoria died of a cerebral hemorrhage, which is a type of stroke. However, the Queen had been growing weaker for several years before her death. Victoria's last sentence was **Had a fair night, but was a little wakeful.** Victoria died at Osborne House on the Isle of Wight on 22 January 1901 after a reign which lasted almost 64 years, the longest in British History. Queen Victoria was talented, intelligent and very creative. We can teach our students to learn new languages from the biography of Queen Victoria.

Conclusion:
